Novichok-5	Binary Nerve Agent (based on A-232)	A few tons	Approved
Novichok-? (No established name)	Binary nerve agent (based on Substance 33)	Tens of tons	Weaponized
Novichok-7	Binary nerve agent	Tens of tons	Tested
