# 1. Preliminary Evaluation: Proposal Checklist

Requirements to be eligible for judging:

Components of this section will be completed by NTI. Once a proposal has met the following criteria it will be sent off to an international panel of judges for second part of the judging process. The Next Generation GHS Network will certify that at least one member from every team is a member of their NextGen Network.

Proposal is between 1,500-2,000 words and outlines how the team will work within Next Generation GHS Network to develop either (1) training and networking opportuniti professionals at all levels to develop an interest and further proficiency in the biosecurity biosafety fields; or (2) opportunities for an educational outreach project to raise public awareness around the importance of biosecurity and biosafety.	es fo

## 2. Evaluation

This part of the proposal evaluation process will be completed by a panel of international judges to assess the quality and achievability of the proposals. Proposals will be evaluated based on the following criteria to receive a score out of a possible 50 points.

To what degree is the proposal focused on either cross-regional or cross-disciplinary work,

promoting the reduction of catastrophic biological risks and enhancing biosafety and biosecurity around the world?
/ 10 points
To what degree does the proposal seem achievable for the budget and personnel proposed?
/ 10 points
To what degree is the proposal connected to GHSA targets, the JEE biosecurity milestones, and the contribution of NextGen to achieving stronger biosecurity and biosafety goals?
/ 5 points
To what degree does the proposal identify a specific mechanism for engaging and involving one or more biosecurity and biosafety experts in the execution of the proposal?
/ 10 points
How likely does it appear that the project can be achieved within six months given the available budget and personnel?
/ 5 points
An additional 10 points may be awarded for exceptional innovation, creativity, and uniqueness of the proposal.

For marking out of 10 points, the marks represent:

- 10- Outstanding
- 8- Very good
- 6- Good
- 4- Fair
- 2- Poor
- 0- Not at all

For marking out of five points, the marks represent:

- 5- Outstanding
- 4- Very good
- 3- Good
- 2- Fair
- 1- Poor
- 0- Not at all

### 3. The Final Evaluation

The top five scoring proposals will be assessed at a roundtable by NTI, NextGen, and biosecurity and biosafety experts from around the world. A winning proposal will be chosen by majority vote, based on the innovation, excellence, and promise that the proposal shows towards promoting biosecurity and biosafety and cross-sectoral and cross-regional partnerships.
